We would value your help and support! The volunteers meet on the 2nd & 4th Monday of the month, at the CMS branch office in the city. We would also like to remind you that if you are sending stamps into our office already trimmed, please leave 3 to 5mm of the envelope around the stamps when trimming, to ensure that you do not damage the stamp. And if your envelopes pre-date 1940, please do not remove the stamps from these envelopes – the envelopes may be more valuable than the stamps themselves!
