The morning teas afterwards are pretty good too.

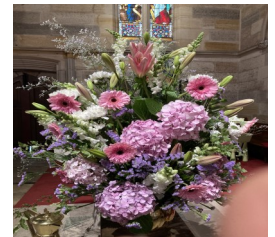
