#### The Advent Book Discussion Group on Zoom: The First Christmas

**Advent Discussion Book:** The First Christmas, What the Gospels Really Teach About Jesus's Birth by Borg and Crossan. The authors show how history has biased our reading of the nativity story as it appears in the Gospels of Matthew or Luke. They ask 'What do these stories mean from the perspective of the 1<sup>st</sup> and 21<sup>st</sup> centuries?' They show that the Christmas story, read in its original context is far richer and more challenging than people imagine.

#### The Season of Advent and Christmas Day 2024 - By Barry Brandy

And the Angels said to the shepherds "Look I bring you good news of a great joy, a joy to be shared by all people" - Luke 21-10

All through this season my mind has been upon St Pauls Church Burwood. A church that I have always referred to as the majestic house of God, militant upon the earth and triumphant in Heaven.

Here at St Paul's, we have been preparing for this day through the season of Advent. We have focused our attention each Sunday on the Advent wreath which you see on the top step of the Chancel. On each of the four Sundays of advent, we light a candle as a symbol of our preparation.

The first candle we light as a symbol of ourselves and all Christian people in the world, waiting expectantly for the coming of Christ, when he shall come again to judge us.

The second candle we light for the prophets of the Old Testament who spoke to us on the coming of Christ in the world.

The third candle we light for John the Baptist, who in his short ministry announced the appearance of Christ the saviour of the world "Behold the lamb of God" he said of Jesus.

Today we will light another candle for Mary, who as a maiden bore the Christ child and nurtured him in an inn in Bethlehem. This time it will be a tall white candle in the centre of the wreath.

A fifth candle will be in honour of Jesus Christ whose birth we celebrate today.

The last verse of an advent carol says "and Christ is in the centre for this is his birthday. With the shining lights of Christmas singing, he has come today."

This day, 25th of December, the Christian church has devised for the birthday of Jesus Christ, the child of Mary, the saviour of the world.

In 355 AD we took over the old Roman feast of Saturnalia and Christianised it. Whereas the Romans celebrated demise of Winter season and the advent of the new sun with all its regeneration of warmth and turning of life in creation, the Christian Church said to the world, we now worship not the son of creation but the birth of the son of God, the saviour and redeemer of the world, and the hope that Christ brings to all people of the world.

For many people in the world today, this will not be a happy Christmas. I remind you of all the women and children who have been abused and some have resulted

in death. People who find the circumstances of their life cause great pain and grief, unhappiness, and a sense of hopelessness. In case we think life is better in other parts of the world, think of all the countries savaged by war, civil war, poverty, hunger, and children in captivity.

What do we expect from the heart of Christians? I suggest we should grasp the message of hope that Christmas brings. Today, start with your family, your neighbours and your friends and this society in which we live and let that extend to those countries that are suffering.

We will light a fifth candle in the wreath this time for Jesus Christ who has come to give light to the world.

Come to St Paul's on the 25th of December to worship him, the Saviour of the world.

Promise of comfort, come.




