The Advent Book Discussion Group on Zoom: The First Christmas

Advent Discussion Book: The First Christmas, What the Gospels Really Teach About Jesus's Birth by Borg and Crossan. The authors show how history has biased our reading of the nativity story as it appears in the Gospels of Matthew of Luke. They ask `What do these stories mean from the perspective of the 1st and 21st centuries?' They show that the Christmas story, read in its original context is far

richer and more challenging than people imagine.

The Sydney Mission-College of the Oratory of the Good Shepherd invites you to share with them in the annual celebration of their patronal festival. Nicholas Ferrar and their family are remembered in the Australian Anglican calendar for their witness to prayer and service. The Ferrar family lived in community in the early seventeenth century at Little Gidding, a pioneer venture in dangerous times.

The Oratory of the Good Shepherd's constitution was formulated at Little Gidding, *circa* 1912.

A sung Eucharist will be held at Christ Church St Laurence, beginning at 6 pm on Wednesday, 4 December, followed by supper in the hall.

1 Samuel 1.4-20; The *Song of Hannah* (APBA p. 429); Hebrews 10.11-14 [15-18] 19-25; Mark 13.1-11

Today's gospel was written in the context of the persecution Christians were already beginning to experience. The words are to encourage them (as well as us) in times of trial, rather than point to

a timetable for God's actions in the world. Whenever we challenge injustice or speak against the powers of oppression, then the powers will fight back, but we can trust that the Holy Spirit will give us the words we need.

- \approx Pray for Christians round the world who face persecution because of their stand for justice.
- Give thanks for the work and witness of the Amity Foundation, created in 1985 on the initiative of Christians in China with the late Bishop K H Ting as its founder. Its main objective has been to help develop poor areas of the country.


