Advent Discussion Book: The First Christmas, What the Gospels Really Teach About Jesus's Birth by Borg and Crossan. The authors show how history has biased our reading of the nativity story as it appears in the Gospels of Matthew or Luke. They ask 'What do these stories mean from the perspective of the 1st and 21st centuries?' They show that the Christmas story, read in its original context is far richer and more challenging than people imagine.

Dear Parishioners,

The Wardens wish to take this opportunity to thank you sincerely for your generous giving during 2024.

As you may be aware, representatives of the Diocese will examine our financial records to determine if our offertories and fundraising are enough to support a priest before giving us the right to choose a rector to follow Fr James. We are happy to inform you that we have done well in this regard in 2024, raising the amount required. Of course, we will need to do the same next year and in 2026.

Unfortunately, we have not received quite enough income from all sources to pay all our expenses and make a surplus before the end of the year. This, in spite of leasing the upper floor of the hall to a dance school at a very good rent. We have also been careful with all expenditure and looked for ways, such as government grants and other fundraising, to increase our income. Just recently, we have suffered an unexpected setback because the dividing fence between our hall and our neighbours in St Paul's Close has collapsed and must be replaced as soon as possible.

The Wardens, therefore, must ask those of you who are able, to consider contributing extra money in the weeks left this year. Even a little extra each week or a one-off general donation would be very helpful in achieving a small surplus or at least breaking even before 31st December. Donations can be placed in the collection bags during any service or paid directly into our bank o

Micah 5.2-5a; The *Song of Zechariah* (APBA p. 31); Hebrews 10.5-10; Luke 1.29-45 [46-55]

Grant that what we have asked in faith we may by your grace receive, through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.


