The Advent Book Discussion Group on Zoom: The First Christmas

Advent Discussion Book: The First Christmas, What the Gospels Really Teach About Jesus's Birth by Borg and Crossan. The authors show how history has biased our reading of the nativity story as it appears in the Gospels of Matthew or Luke. They ask 'What do these stories mean from the perspective of the 1st and 21st centuries?' They show that the Christmas story, read in its original context is far richer and more challenging than people imagine.

What a wonderful finish to our 2024 Lunchtime Recitals!

It was most unfortunate that the 'cellist from the *Mirabella Trio*, Minah Choe, was unavailable to play. The Trio's two other players, pianist Kayoko Nishiwaki and clarinettist Hanae McLean graciously rescheduled the program to involve pianist D J Ha. What D J had to offer was a revelation to us all. He can only use his left hand. As a result of a stroke when he was younger, D J was left paralysed on his right side. This interrupted his already well established career as a pianist. With a superb technique, tenacity and inspiration, D J has commenced performing again. He arranges music as well as performing music written for the left hand. Absolutely amazing!

Hanae and Kayoko delighted the audience with excellent ensemble and superb interpretation of each piece. Hanae's lyrical cantabile was exquisite, with the eloquent high register floating through the Church. The unaccompanied 'Ulpirra' was lively and catchy, ending with a joyous shout and stamp.

We were privileged to hear all three musicians and to appreciate the musicianship and artistic dedication.

NICHOLAS FERRAR DAY 2024

The Sydney Mission-College of the Oratory of the Good Shepherd invites you to share with them in the annual celebration of their patronal festival. Nicholas Ferrar and their family are remembered in the Australian Anglican calendar for their witness to prayer and service. The Ferrar family lived in community in the early seventeenth century at Little Gidding, a pioneer venture in dangerous times.

The Oratory of the Good Shepherd's constitution was formulated at Little Gidding, circa 1912.


