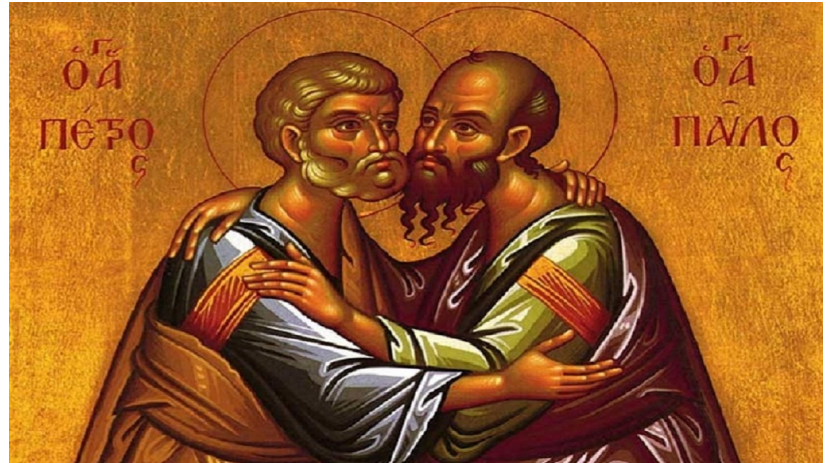

Ordinary Sunday 13 B – Sunday 30 June 2024

2 Samuel 1.1, 17-27; Psalm 130; 2 Corinthians 8.[1-6] 7-15; Mark 5.21-43

Today's gospel sees Jesus healing a woman with a kind of haemorrhagic disease as well as Jairus' daughter who was at the point of death. Jesus tells the woman that her faith has made her whole and he tells Jairus not to fear, but rather, to believe. He says to the girl, *Talitha cum* – little girl, get up, in Aramaic. That phrase still means the same thing to those who speak Assyrian, otherwise known as neo-Aramaic, in the streets of Fairfield and surrounding suburbs in Sydney. Members of the Assyrian Church of the East, whose historic patriarchate is based in Iraq, now live in significant numbers in Sydney and Melbourne,

≈ Pray for the Church's healing ministry through the Guild of St Raphael, and through hospitals and clinics throughout the Anglican Communion.

≈ Give thanks for the witness of St George's College in East Jerusalem, praying that they will be able to withstand the lack of student pilgrims because of their death at this time of fighting.

WARDEN'S REPORT

JUNE, 2024

Dear Parishioners,

The Wardens and the Parish Council are grateful to all of you for your continued loyal support over the last years and we hope that this support will be forthcoming in the future.

The Wardens wish to inform you of the important events that are going to occur in the Parish in the next three or four years. Towards the end of 2026, we are anticipating that Fr James will begin his well-deserved retirement and, at some stage during 2027/2028, St Paul's will welcome a new rector. If our elected nominators are, on our behalf, to be involved in this process, we will need to comply with the expectations of the Diocese of Sydney. Failure to comply will mean the appointment of a new rector by the Archbishop, without our input. The Diocese will determine our right to nominate our next rector on the following grounds - financial viability and a habitable rectory.

FINANCIAL VIABILITY

After Fr James resigns, the Diocese will analyse our financial records for the three years prior (that is 2024, 2025 and 2026). We need to show that in those years we generated enough income to pay the rector's stipend and the monthly fees collected by the Diocese, It is important to understand that this income must only be derived from the Sunday collections, general (non specific) donations and fundraising activities. Income from rent, investments and specific purpose donations cannot be included, although, of course we need all this income to meet our other financial commitments.

Therefore, we ask all Parishioners to continue to give generously by placing your offering in the collection bags during services, by paying directly into St Paul's bank account or paying by other electronic means. Supporting fund raising is also very important so we ask you to continue to buy from the Trading Table, buy raffle tickets and attend social functions.

It is imperative that we maintain or increase our level of giving during these years.

With your help and generosity, we will meet this expectation of the Diocese and choose our next rector who will carry on the traditions of St Paul's.

THE RECTORY

After Fr James leaves us, Bishop Michael or his nominee will inspect the Rectory as the Parish must be able to offer a new rector and his family a residence. Bishop Michael has advised that the rectory must be habitable but, as it is a very old house, it need not comply with Diocesan standards in order to gain the right of nomination.

We have approached two builders to give opinions on what work may be required to bring the house up to an acceptable standard for a new rector. Any works needed will be carried out after Fr James departs.

Funding this work poses a problem as we are always having to work very hard in order to achieve a small surplus at the end of every year. Bishop Michael has given us some preliminary advice about funding and the Wardens are already considering the options.

The Wardens will communicate with the Parish as decisions are taken by the Wardens and Parish Council.

We believe that we can use the next few years to plan carefully for the changes that are coming to St Paul's, so that we can calmly and peacefully move into the next stage of building God's kingdom in Burwood.
