Welcome to St Paul's


We warmly welcome you and are glad that you have come to worship God with us today, Christmas Day, as we celebrate the Nativity of Our Lord.







Prayers of the Faithful

The following response is used:

Lord, we rejoice at your coming:

Almighty God, you have promised to hear our prayers. Grant that what we have asked in faith we may by your grace receive, through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

A selection of Scripture sentences may be used concluding with the Prayer of Approach recited together:

We do not presume to come to your table, merciful Lord, trusting in our own righteousness, but in your manifold and great mercies. We are not worthy so much as to gather up the crumbs under your table. But you are the same Lord whose nature is always to have mercy. Grant us, therefore, gracious Lord, so to eat the flesh of your dear Son Jesus Christ, and to drink his blood, that we may evermore dwell in him and he in us. Amen.

Confession and Absolution

The priest introduces the confession. Christ the grace of God has dawned upon the world with healing for all. (Silence may be kept)

Let us bring our weaknesses and infirmities to him, confessing our sins in penitence and faith.

Merciful God, our maker and our judge, we have sinned against you in thought, word and deed, and in what we have failed to do: we have not loved you with our whole heart; we have not loved our neighbours as ourselves; we repent, and are sorry for all our sins. Father, forgive us. Strengthen us to love and obey you in newness of life; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

The priest pronounces the Absolution.

Almighty God, who has promised forgiveness to all who turn to him in faith: pardon you and set you free from all your sins, strengthen you in all goodness and keep you in eternal life, through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

All stand.

Greeting of Peace

The Greeting of Peace is introduced with these words:

Unto us a child is born, unto us a son is given, and his name shall be called the Prince of Peace.

We are the body of Christ.

His Spirit is with us.

The peace of the Lord be always with you. And also with you.

All may exchange a sign of peace.
