Pew Reflections – Anglican Board of Mission

Ordinary Sunday 5 C – Sunday 9 February 2025

Isaiah 6.1-8 [9-13]; Psalm 138; 1 Corinthians 15.1-11; Luke 5.1-11

Much is made of St Peter’s denial of Christ just before the Crucifixion.

In today’s Gospel reading, however, we see another side of him: Jesus tell him to go out into the deep water and lay his nets. Peter, quite reasonably, explains to the rabbi that he and his team have been out fishing all night but have not caught a thing. Nonetheless, he obeys Jesus’ command and has a catch so big that he realises Jesus’ divinity and asks him to leave because he is but a ‘sinful man’.
