nor forsake me when my strength fails.

10 For my enemies speak against me: *(pause)*  
and those that watch for my life conspire together, saying,

11 'God has forsaken him: *(pause)*  
pursue him, take him, for there is none to save him.'

12 Be not far from me, O God: *(pause)*  
my God, make haste to help me.

13 Let my adversaries be confounded and put to shame: *(pause)*  
let those who seek my hurt be covered with scorn and disgrace.
