We warmly welcome you and are glad that you have come to worship God with us today on Trinity Sunday and we welcome our Regional Bishop, Michael Stead, as he confers the Rite of Confirmation.

Whether you are visiting for a short while, have moved here and are joining our Parish, or are returning to your faith, I welcome you to St Paul's Anglican Church, Burwood.

This historic church, dedicated to St Paul the Apostle & Martyr, was designed by the Australian colonial architect Edmund Blacket. It had its foundation stone laid on 29 July 1871 and the first service was held in the church on Saturday 27 April 1872. Since its earliest days St Paul's has maintained a fine reputation for liturgy and music in the Tractarian tradition.

We are very glad that you are here and we look forward to getting to know you. Refreshments (tea/coffee), when served, are available in the Parish Hall immediately following the service. The hall can be found by turning left when leaving the church.

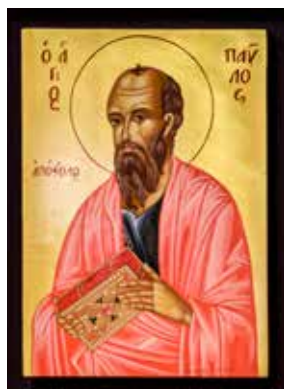

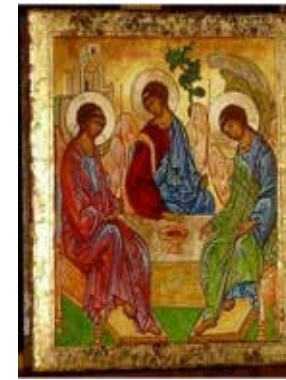

Jesus said: 'This is the great and first commandment. And a second is like it: you shall love your neighbour as yourself.'

(Silence may be kept)

Let us therefore bring our sins before the one true God, in penitence and faith.

**Merciful God, our maker and our judge,
we have sinned against you in thought, word and deed,
and in what we have failed to do:
we have not loved you with our whole heart;
we have not loved our neighbours as ourselves;

The bishop pronounces the Absolution.

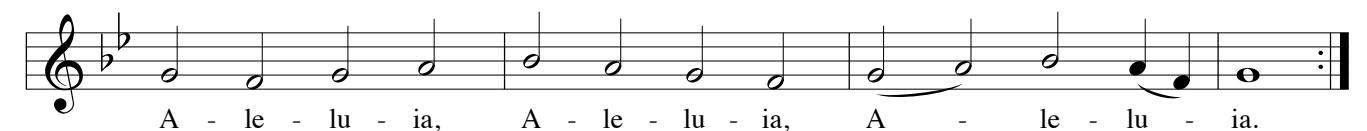

Sermon

Confirmation

The priest introduces the confirmation with the following words.

In confirmation those who have been previously baptised come to confirm their baptismal promises and to receive the laying on of the bishop’s hand with prayer. We pray that those who are confirmed will be empowered by the Holy Spirit for the ministry and service to which God shall call them.

Presentation

The bishop invites the sponsors of confirmation candidates to present the candidates.

We welcome *those* who come to be confirmed. I invite *their* sponsor(s) to present *them* now.

We present [N] who comes to be confirmed.

Decision

The bishop says to those who are to receive the laying on of hands:

Before God and this congregation, you must affirm that you turn to Christ and reject all that is evil:

Do you turn to Christ?
I turn to Christ.

Do you repent of your sins?
I repent of my sins.

Do you reject selfish living, and all that is false and unjust?
I reject them all.

Do you renounce Satan and all evil?
I renounce all that is evil.

Almighty God deliver you from the powers of darkness, and lead you in the light of Christ to his everlasting kingdom.
Amen.

The bishop says to the candidates:

Will you, by God’s grace, strive to live your whole life as a disciple of Christ, loving God with all your heart, and your neighbour, as yourself?
I will, with God’s help.

All stand. The bishop says to the congregation:

You have heard these our brothers and sisters renew their response to Christ. Will you support them?
We will.

The bishop continues:

Let us pray for those who have affirmed their baptism and are to receive the laying on of hands.

Merciful God, deliver them from all evil that they may walk in the way of truth and life;

Lord in your mercy, **hear our prayer.**

Open their hearts by the Holy Spirit to your grace and truth;

Lord in your mercy, **hear our prayer.**

Keep them in the faith and communion of your holy Church;

Lord in your mercy, **hear our prayer.**

Send them into the world to witness to your love and justice;

Lord in your mercy, **hear our prayer.**

Bring them and us all into the fullness of your peace and glory;

Lord in your mercy, **hear our prayer.**

The bishop addresses the candidates, their sponsors, and all in the congregation.

The Profession of Faith

Defend, O Lord, your servant [N] with your heavenly grace, that *he/she* may continue yours for ever, and daily increase in your Holy Spirit more and more until *he/she* comes to your everlasting kingdom.

The candidate and congregation answers:

Amen.

The bishop anoints the candidate with the Oil of Chrism.
