# Welcome to St Paul's

Today we celebrate the 128<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Dedication of this historic church dedicated to St Paul the Apostle and Martyr. We are delighted to welcome The Reverend Jonathan Adams, Precentor of St Andrew's Cathedral Sydney, as our guest preacher today.

The church was dedicated on 7 July 1897 by the Bishop of Bathurst, Charles Camidge (1838-1911).

St Paul's was designed by the Australian colonial architect, Edmund Blacket and since its earliest days has maintained a fine reputation for liturgy and music in the Tractarian tradition, and continues to be a beacon of Faith, Hope and Love, both within and beyond the bounds of Burwood.

Today's service is accompanied by a small ensemble of instruments and as beautiful as the music may be, it is not offered as a musical performance but rather as an act of worship, intended to inspire and draw us closer to God. As with all services of public worship there is no charge to attend, however, I invite you to contribute, as you are able, to support the continuation of the musical tradition that has been an important part of this church since its establishment in 1871. This can be done through the offertory plate, the donation tap machine at the door or through the various methods mentioned at the back of this order of service.

At the conclusion of today's Orchestral Mass you are warmly invited to join in sharing fellowship and refreshments in the parish hall with a Soup and Slice lunch.

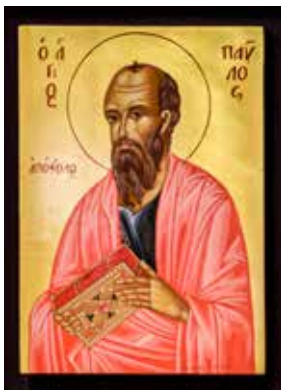

## First Reading: 1 Kings 8.22–24, 27–30

Then Solomon stood before the altar of the Lord in the presence of the whole assembly of Israel and spread out his hands to heaven. He said, “O Lord, God of Israel, there is no God like you in heaven above or on earth beneath, keeping covenant and steadfast love with your servants who walk before you with all their heart, the covenant that you kept for your servant my father David as you declared to him; you promised with your mouth and have this day fulfilled with your hand.

“But will God indeed dwell on the earth? Even heaven and the highest heaven cannot contain you, much less this house that I have built! ## Second Reading: 1 Peter 2.4–10

Come to him, a living stone, though rejected by mortals yet chosen and precious in God's sight, and like living stones let yourselves be built into a spiritual house, to be a holy priesthood, to offer spiritual sacrifices acceptable to God through Jesus Christ. For it stands in scripture:

"See, I am laying in Zion a stone, a cornerstone chosen and precious, and whoever believes in him will not be put to shame." This honour, then, is for you who believe, but for those who do not believe, "The stone that the builders rejected has become the very head of the corner," and "A stone that makes them stumble and a rock that makes them fall."

They stumble because they disobey the word, as they were destined to do.

But you are a chosen people, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, God's own people, in order that you may proclaim the excellence of him who called you out of darkness into his marvelous light.

Once you were not a people, but now you are God's people; once you had not received mercy, but now you have received mercy.

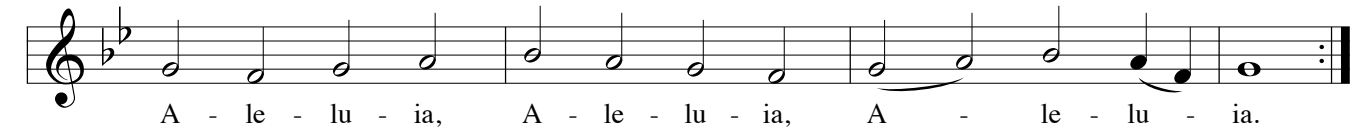

## Confession and Absolution

*The priest introduces the confession.*

We are a temple of God's indwelling Holy Spirit, yet we have grieved him. The temple of our bodies does not belong to us, but was bought with the price of Christ's precious blood. So we come, in sorrow yet with confidence, to ask forgiveness of our Father in heaven.

*(Silence may be kept)*

Let us then open our hearts and confess our sins in penitence and faith.

**Merciful God,  
our maker and our judge,  
we have sinned against you  
in thought, word and deed, and in what we have failed to do:  
we have not loved you with our whole heart;  
we have not loved our neighbours as ourselves;  
we repent, and are sorry for all our sins.  
Father, forgive us.

through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.**

*The priest pronounces the Absolution*
