## Welcome to St Paul's

Today we celebrate the 129<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Dedication of this historic church dedicated to St Paul the Apostle and Martyr. We are delighted to welcome The Right Reverend Donald Kirk, Bishop of Riverina, as our guest celebrant and preacher and his wife, Camryn, as they join us for this special day in the life of our parish.

The church was dedicated on 7 July 1897 by the Bishop of Bathurst, Charles Camidge (1838-1911).

St Paul's was designed by the Australian colonial architect, Edmund Blacket and since its earliest days has maintained a fine reputation for liturgy and music in the Tractarian tradition, and continues to be a beacon of Faith, Hope and Love, both within and beyond the bounds of Burwood.

Today's service is accompanied by a small ensemble of instruments and as beautiful as the music may be, it is not offered as a musical performance but rather as an act of worship, intended to inspire and draw us closer to God. As with all services of public worship there is no charge to attend, however, you are invited to contribute, as you are able, to support the continuation of the musical tradition that has been an important part of this church since its establishment in 1871. This can be done through the offertory plate, the donation tap machine at the door or through the various methods mentioned at the back of this order of service.

At the conclusion of today's Orchestral Mass you are warmly invited to join in sharing fellowship and refreshments in the parish hall and have the opportunity to extend your good wishes to Bishop Donald as he prepares to retire from the Diocese of Riverina next month.

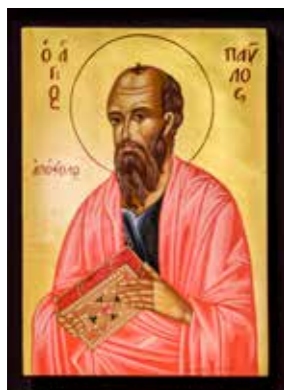

## First Reading: 1 Kings 8.22–24, 27–30

Then Solomon stood before the altar of the Lord in the presence of the whole assembly of Israel and spread out his hands to heaven. ## Second Reading: 1 Peter 2.4–10

Come to him, a living stone, though rejected by mortals yet chosen and precious in God’s sight, and like living stones let yourselves be built into a spiritual house, to be a holy priesthood, to offer spiritual sacrifices acceptable to God through Jesus Christ. For it stands in scripture:

“See, I am laying in Zion a stone, a cornerstone chosen and precious, and whoever believes in him will not be put to shame.” This honour, then, is for you who believe, but for those who do not believe, “The stone that the builders rejected has become the very head of the corner,” and “A stone that makes them stumble and a rock that makes them fall.”

They stumble because they disobey the word, as they were destined to do.

But you are a chosen people, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, God’s own people, in order that you may proclaim the excellence of him who called you out of darkness into his marvelous light.

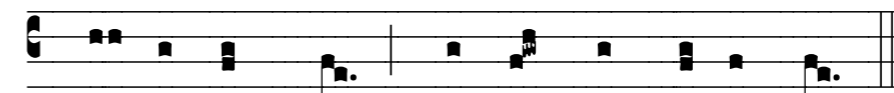

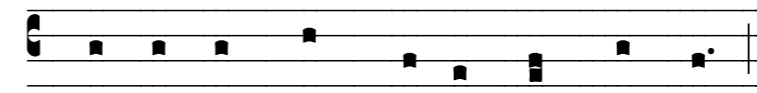

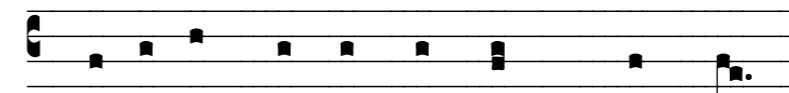
