We warmly welcome you and are glad that you have come to worship God with us today as we commemorate the Feast of the Martyrs of New Guinea.

Whether you are visiting for a short while, have moved here and are joining our Parish, or are returning to your faith, I welcome you to St Paul's Anglican Church, Burwood.

This historic church, dedicated to St Paul the Apostle & Martyr, was designed by the Australian colonial architect Edmund Blacket. It had its foundation stone laid on 29 July 1871 and the first service was held in the church on Saturday 27 April 1872. Since its earliest days St Paul's has maintained a fine reputation for liturgy and music in the Tractarian tradition.

We are very glad that you are here and we look forward to getting to know you. Refreshments (tea/coffee), when served, are available in the Parish Hall immediately following the service. The hall can be found by turning left when leaving the church.

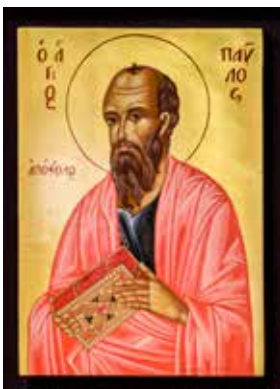
Martyrs of New Guinea

The Martyrs – often called the New Guinea Martyrs – refer to twelve Australian, English and Papuan Anglican missionaries who were brutally murdered in August 1942. Their deaths came largely at the hands of the invading Japanese forces.

The Bishop of New Guinea (the Anglican Diocese of New Guinea was, at the time, a diocese of the ecclesiastical Province of Queensland) had instructed Anglican missionaries to remain at their posts despite the Japanese invasion.

New Guinea Martyrs Day is observed in the Anglican calendar on 2 September.
